What have we been up to this week?

Reception

Welcome back to the final half term of Reception. This half term we will be spending lots of time preparing for the move to Year I, ensuring that children are fully prepared for the transition.

In English, we found a whale that needed our help. We thought about how we could look after it, thinking about its needs and what it might eat. We read The Storm Whale, by Benji Davies, and made links to our own ideas about how to look after a lost whale.

In Maths, we have been learning about the number system beyond 20, we looked at a 0-99 square, and noticed patterns in the lines of numbers. We applied our knowledge of digits to identify the missing number from the tracks.

In our topics this week, we have started to identify key features of the seaside, and compared the setting to our own environment. We looked at some seaside resorts around the UK.

Reminders: Please can you ensure that children's reading books are in school each day, to ensure their availability when there are opportunities to read with an adult. Please can we also ask that snack money is paid ASAP.



Year 1

It's been a fantastic start to the second half of the term! Year One have returned full of energy and enthusiasm.

In English, we've introduced our exciting new topic based on the story The Last Wolf. To help bring the story to life, the children have enjoyed engaging in roleplay, stepping into the shoes of the characters to explore their thoughts, feelings, and actions. This has really helped deepen their understanding of the story and inspired some brilliant discussions and imaginative responses.

In Maths, the children have now completed their work on subtracting within 10 using partitioning. They've worked hard to build their confidence with this method and are now ready to move on to the next stage in their learning journey.

In Science, we've continued our exploration of energy sources, looking at how we use energy both in the classroom and at home. The children have shown great curiosity, asking thoughtful questions and sharing their own observations about how we power different appliances and why it's important to think about where our energy comes from.

Year 2

Year 2 have settled in well after the half term. We have worked really hard and have been focused with our learning.

In English we have begun reading our new narrative 'Rosie Revere Engineer', making predictions and looking closely at vocabulary. We have also written a character description for Rosie Revere, which will help to embed ideas for our invention narratives.

In Maths we have been finding the difference using number lines, bar charts and bar models. We have also been solving word problems using our learned subtraction methods.

In Geography we have explored the continent of North America. We have compared the continents we have learned so far in terms of size and population as well as the number of countries.

What a fun week of learning! Keep up the enthusiasm Year 2!



What have we been up to this week?

Year 3+

Year 3 have started off our last term of the year really well. We have compared destinations in maths, looking at the start and end times. In English, we have begun our new unit 'Egyptology', we have predicted what might happen and we have also wrote sentences using vocabulary from the vehicle and example texts. In science we have looked at the function of a skeleton and we have also looked at the function of muscles. In geography we have wrote a fact file all about Greece.



Year 4

Year 4 have had another great push on times tables and most of us have completed our multiplication check. We have also completed arithmetic assessments which covered all four operations, and fractions. We can't wait to see our results. In English, we were introduced to a persuasive letter written by the story enders imploring parents to forgo bedtime stories until the happy endings have been returned. We used it to explore some new vocabulary such as traumatic, catastrophic and conscience. In Geography, we continued our work on Rivers and investigated how rivers are used. We explored the positive and negative effects of each use. In Science, We continued our work on electricity by investigating which materials are conductors and which are insulators. In Music, we were very excited to begin learning how to play the guitar. Miss Mather was very impressed!

Year 5

The children have settled quickly back into a routine after the half term. In English, we have completed our survival narrative- the children have tried hard to include the writer's knowledge and vocabulary we have discussed over recent weeks. In computing we have started creating films on the I-Pads, considering the different techniques to get the best shot. We are all looking forward to our visit to BeWILDerwood next Tuesday. Please make sure you have given permission for your child to attend. There will be further information next week about our residential visit to Conway. Don't forget to check if you have an outstanding balance for this visit.





Year 6 have had a busy but enjoyable first week back that has included pie charts, discussions about secondary schools in PSHE, as well as visits from staff form Wade Deacon and OCA, as well as beginning our leavers performance. We have also been writing diary entries as the character Auggie from RJ Palacio's wonderful novel 'Wonder'. Don't forget that we are going to Gullivers World on July 16th and payment is required in advance, and on the last day of term there will be a Leavers performance in the hall for all year 6 parents.
