#### **REMINDERS**

#### Reception



Reception have continued their learning this week on our Dan and the Dark Hole story. We have been enjoying learning the songs for the parts of the

story, and I am sure they are singing these at home!

We have learnt 'h, b, f, and l' in Phonics and in Maths, we have been learning about 'more, fewer, most and least'.

The children have enjoyed their PE sessions with Mr Ireland and are looking forward to their dance party as their Ditton Dot reward this week. We enjoyed looking at the harvest vegetables from our school allotment in our key groups.

#### Year 1

Year 1 have made a fantastic start to writing their stories this week. We are really proud of the children's efforts and we can't wait to read

them once completed. The children have also continued to deepen their understanding of numbers within 10. They have been working on

number lines and ordering numbers. We finished the week with some art. The children enjoyed creating different textures and making rubbings using crayons. Next week, we have a Parents Phonics/Reading information meeting in the hall. This will hopefully support you with helping children at home and preparing for the Phonics Screening Check in June. The meeting is on Thursday 19th October at 9am.

#### Year 2



On Tuesday, Year 2 enjoyed a special visit from local Firefighters. We were given the opportunity to explore the fire engine and look

at the specialist equipment they use to carry out their rescues. We discussed how these tools were different to

what was available back in 1666 during the Great Fire of London and agreed that we are much safer in 2023 and are thankful for the Fire and

Rescue service. Some of us even had the chance to try on some of the firefighter's uniforms, which was lots of fun!

#### Year 3

This week. Year 3 enjoyed taking part in a 'resilience' workshop to mark World Mental Health Day. The message is important and it is always encouraged that we try our best and work together...and never give up! In Maths, we have started our work on addition and subtraction and this will continue next week. In Science, we have been learning about the function of our skeleton and naming different bones. In English, we have completed our 'threat narrative' and the children should be proud of their efforts -well done all!

#### Year 4

This week we have finished analysing our newspaper report and we are now writing our own. In maths we have moved past place value and have now started to look at addition, starting with building and securing some of our mental skills and moving onto using written methods. In PSHE we looked more into resilience and continued to explore Hinduism in RE. A big well done to everyone who is completing 30 minutes on TT Rockstars, improving your mental multiplication recall will have a fantastic impact on later units in Maths.

#### Year 5

In English this week, the children have been looking at the key features of biographies. Next week, they will use this to help them write

their own biography. In maths, we have explored strategies for adding numbers. We joined a Zoom meeting on 'resilience' to mark World Mental Health Day. In art, the children have been creating 3D Picasso style portraits.

#### Year 6

Year 6 have been busy writing Bravery Award speeches this week, having researched Anne Frank. In Maths we have been multiplying 4 digit by 2 digit numbers while in Science we have created our own branching trees to classify animals. The children have been very active in PE and looked at reconciliation in RE. In Computing, we have discussed plagiarism and in History we have explored the assassination of Archduke Franz Ferdinand.



There have been two virtual visitors we have heard from this week - Adam from One Goal held a session about resilience on Tuesday, while on Thursday we heard all about the Wilding School project that will be happening next year and see 30% of our grounds be used for nature, including lots of tree planting.
