#### Reception

In Reception this week we have been finalising the endings of our Little Red themed stories. Children



were able to retell the ending of the story and write what had happened, including some new vocabulary.

In Maths, we have been learning about directional language, we directed friends to a teddy bear and made our own Maps to help direct Little Red to Grandma's house.

We have been reading longer words in Phonics, chunking them up to read words such as 'lunchbox' and 'farmyard'. We also enjoyed a visit to Forest School, where we made faces using leaves and we have enjoyed our Music lessons with Miss Underwood, using 'Funky Junk' as percussion instruments.

#### Year 1

In Year 1 this week...

#### English

This week we finished writing our finding narratives based on the story 'Hermelin' by Mini Grey. The children have produced some great writing, and it is lovely to see their independence developing.

#### Maths

This week we have been bridging 10 when adding within 20. The children started by using tens frames before moving on to number lines.

#### DT

This week we made our delicious banana desserts. The children planned their products first by selecting fruits and toppings they liked, and it was lovely to see their creations come to life!

#### Year 2

In year 2 this week we have started a new book in English - Grandad's Island by Benji Davies. We will continue exploring the story before writing our own narrative in a similar style. We look



forward to seeing what the children produce!

In Maths we have continued working on division, looking closely at the relationship between division and multiplication.

We enjoyed a martial arts demonstration from our special visitor on Friday and learnt the importance of self-defence.

#### Year 3

We made our own dough for our burger buns, we chopped vegetables and even made our own smoothies – it was great fun. Many of the children tried something new and enjoyed the experience. In Music, we have started to write our own musical notation. In other areas, we have been learning about division in Maths and how to identify risks at home during PHSE. In maths we have continued with fractions, working with mixed and improper fractions, we found it a little tricky at first but all showed resilience and perseverance. In geography we learnt about 'The Lost City' Machu Piccu. We enjoyed learning about how archaeologists think people lived on a mountain and discussing the positives and negatives of living there.

#### Year 5

The children completed the final part of their character narrative this week We have now moved on to preparing to write a bargaining letter, using our recent text 'The Promise' as our starting point. In maths, we have been reading and interpreting information displayed in graphs and charts. Science has given us an opportunity to research a variety of life cycles and we have started to look for similarities and differences between these.

#### Year 6

Year 6 have been busy preparing for SATS and getting stuck into plenty of Maths problems and reading comprehensions. Thanks to all the pupils and parents that have made the after-school tuition sessions happen; these have been very important in terms of making progress in the areas identified by teachers. Please can we make an extra effort to continue attending these, as well as ensuring children are in school unless they are definitely not well enough to come as the learning that takes place in the forthcoming months will be essential for preparing them for secondary school. In other subjects, we have playing badminton in PE, singing in Music, and moving/resizing 3D shapes in Computing.
