This week, we have taken a closer look at the features of our story in English. We identified key features that made Wise Owl happy. In Maths

we have been recapping our number bonds to 5, becoming fluent in recalling them. In Phonics we have continued our learning on Phase 3, learning more diagraphs and we are getting so good at reading words and short sentences. We enjoyed a trip to the forest with Kev, building bug houses out of sticks. We have also enjoyed a visit from The Dog's Trust, where we learnt about behaviours to keep us save around dogs.

Year 1



In Year 1 this week...

History This week we have been

comparing the diaries of Samuel Pepys and John Evelyn during The Great Fire of London. The children were able to identify the similarities and differences when comparing the diary entries.

Computing

This week we have continued to focus on digital writing. The children are becoming more familiar with the keyboard and different functions of the keys. The children were able to use the text curser, space bar and backspace effectively to type a sentence.

This week we read the biblical story 'Noah and the Ark'. The children were able to identify the rainbow as a symbol of God's promise to Noah and linked this to our previous lesson 'what is a promise?'.

Year 2

Year 2 have been completing assessments in Reading and Maths this week and have really impressed us.

We had a visit from the Dog's Trust on Thursday and the children learnt some valuable tips on how to stay safe around dogs.





In Maths we have been learning about arrays. Children have been able

to link arrays, repeated addition and multiplication.



Year 3

This week, the children have completed their termly assessments in English and Maths – we are very proud with their efforts!

In other subjects, we have been learning about where the Romans settled and how the trade empire grew!

In RE, we have continued to look at the Christian faith and the Holy Spirit.

In computing, we have started our work on animations and in Music, we are continuing to learn one of the songs from the Mario movie – it's very catchy! We look forward to seeing everyone in their costumes for World Book Day next week – which word will you choose?

Year 4



This week, year 4 have started their new text in English 'The Lost Happy Endings.' It was really exciting exploring the clues that were left for us and predicting what the text was going to be about, we also wrote a poem about the character Jub.

In Geography we used atlases to explore landscapes in the seven continents, we discussed topographical maps and how they show the different heights on land. We found mountains using the map symbol and recorded the name and height of each one. We were very impressed with what the children remembered from year 2 and 3. We are very excited for World Book Day next week and are looking forward to seeing some wonderful vocabulary and costumes!

Year 5

In English this week, we have used drama and role play to explore how our main character might have felt. This will help when we come to write our character narrative next week. In science, we researched an important scientist in the field of biology, choosing between Jane Goodall and David Attenborough. We have worked hard to complete our reading and maths assessments this week. In computing, we continued our work in creating vectors, and managed to apply our news skills to create some colourful parrots.

On Friday, we were visited by the Dogs Trust and enjoyed learning about how to behave when around dogs.

Year 6

This week, year 6 have been busy planning and writing our environmental narrative. We have enjoyed the book "Varmints" by Helen Ward and Mark Craste and are using this as inspiration for our own tales of a beautiful landscape turned ugly by technology, industry and Greed!! In Maths, we are continuing our work on the relationships between fractions, decimals and percentages. We looked at the different types of physical Geography there is in South America and were able to compare the varying climates that make up such a large continent. We have also taken part in workshops on the dangers of tobacco and today, we will enjoy a visit from the Dogs Trust!!
