#### Reception



This week we have been enjoying a change in the weather, meaning we could get outside more and investigate the

natural world. We have been planting seeds and bedding plants, and cannot wait to see them grow. We have been thinking about how the trees have changed.

#### English

We completed the final two parts of our instructions for how to plant a tree and used them to plant our own seeds outside.

#### Maths

We have been learning about weight, using the balance buckets and spring balances. Children have learnt some new vocabulary to use, test them out at home! Reminders:

- As the weather gets warmer, it may be time to start sending children in with sun hats in their bags. It is still important to bring a coat in case of rain.

#### Year 1

This week the children have continued to explore Hinduism in RE. They have learnt about the three forms of God that make up the trimurti.

In science, the children have explored their senses. They went outside and used their senses to describe the environment around them.

In Spanish, the children have revisited colours, along with numbers and dinosaur names – wow!

We have also been doing lots of phonics in class, in the lead up to the Phonics Screening Check in June. Please ensure that you read every night with your child to support them with this.

#### Year 2

This week Year 2 have continued their work on fractions and have been investigating equivalent fractions such as ½ and 2/4.

In English next week we'll start to write our letters of persuasion. The children spent the past week collating their ideas and are looking forward to trying to convince the King to change his mind.

Science this week involved a trip to the forest to investigate habitats and microhabitats.

In RE we continued our learning around Hinduism and learnt about their place of worship – the mandir, and the special items they use to worship.

#### Year 3



This week, we have enjoyed some 'hotseating' as part of our work in English. The



children have got into character and developed their speaking and listening skills. In Maths, we have started to look at adding and subtracting fractions. We are working hard to develop our arithmetic skills in Maths and the children are working hard to practise methods for division and multiplication. In Spanish, we were learning numbers up to 15 and we always enjoy singing songs to help us remember new vocabulary. In PE, the children have enjoyed playing some cricket and we have also been joined by the LFC foundation who have been working with both Year 3 classes in recent weeks.

#### Year 4

This week year 4 have been working hard to finish their stories based on our vehicle text: The Journey. In maths we have continued to explore decimals and have now compared, ordered and started dividing by 10 and 100 into decimal places. In RE we have continued to look at the Islamic faith and how they celebrate festivals. In Spanish we are expanding our knowledge of body parts by creating our own yoga sequences.

We would like to remind everyone about using the Maths frame website to concentrate on the times tables they are struggling with.

#### Year 5

Year 5 have been busy exploring more pages from our text – The Lost Book of Adventure. We are gathering ideas to help us write a survival guide. We made visited our forest area and made shelters with Kev and will use our experiences to inform our planning. In maths, we have continued our 3D shape work, looking at how 3D shapes can be created from nets. In science, we have investigated which solids are soluble in water.

#### Year 6

The children have been working their socks off this week in preparation for the SATS tests that begin a week on Monday. As well as honing their arithmetic skills, they have been working with angles and nets of 3D shapes, as well as answering grammar and punctuation questions. There are 10 questions to complete on this for homework that will be important to complete in preparation for the first test. We are also writing a third person narrative of a sequel to the hit book and film 'Wonder'. In PE, the children have been refining their cricket skills.
