### What have we been up to this week?

### Reception

We have had a super busy and enjoyable week in reception!

In English, we have been diving deeper into our story, The Storm Whale. We have enjoyed learning our story song and making up actions to help us remember key story vocabulary. We have also mapped out the story using illustrations and labels and have written some super sentences about the characters!

In maths, we have been building on composition of numbers to ten. We have used a systematic approach to recall number bonds to ten and have used the part-whole method to show our learning.
On Friday we had a very exciting trip to Knowsley Safari Park! We loved learning about different animals and seeing them up close! The children displayed excellent behaviour and represented our school brilliantly! We had so much fun that some children even had a little snooze on the coach journey home!





What another busy week we have had in Year !!

This week the children have worked incredibly hard doing their Phonics Screening Checks. We are so proud of them all.

We have started to read our new class story in English, The Last Wolf by Mini Grey. The children are enjoying it and can't wait to see what happens.

We have also completed lots of assessments in English, reading and maths. Again, the children have worked very hard on this.

We had an amazing time at Knowsley Safari Park today! The children saw a range of animals and particularly enjoyed the sealions and birds of prey.

#### Year 2

We always work hard in Year 2, but wow we have been busy this week!

All week we have been working hard to complete our end of key stage I assessments. Although we are mindful not to put any added pressure on the children, the children are always determined to do their very best.

We are so proud of the children and how well they have worked this week. As a thank you and to say 'well done', we treated the children to a lolly ice and an extra play in the sunshine Friday afternoon. We even had the parachute out. Look at our happy smiley (and sticky!) faces





### What have we been up to this week?

Year 3\*

This week the children have worked very hard during their assessments. We are extremely proud of you all! In Science, the children enjoyed learning the function of a skeleton.

In RE, we enjoyed learning about the festival Rakshk Bandhan. We are looking forward to starting our new unit next week!

#### Year 4

This week, the focus has once again been the multiplication check. The children have worked hard all year to learn their times tables and we have now completed all checks — well done everybody for your efforts.

We have also been completing our end of year assessments in English and Maths. The children have worked hard and we are proud of them all.

Next week, we will begin our new Science topic about animals (including humans). Over the weekend, please think about what you already know about the benefits of exercise and the importance of maintaining good hygiene.





In maths this week, Year 5 have been continuing to improve their arithmetic skills, a well as looking at different mental and written strategies they can use to answer a variety of questions.

In English, we have started our new topic, with the outcome of writing a survival guide. Children have come up with some brilliant ideas so far!

On Tuesday, Year 5 thoroughly enjoyed their visit to Bewilderwood. We built dens, had a go on the zipwire, faced our fears on the broken bridge and worked together to find the exit of the Sky maze.

Year E

This week Year 6 have been busy writing their own sequel to the book "Wonder" by R.J. Palacio (who is one of our focus authors). The children have had to plan this extended piece entirely on their own and have been very imaginative in their choices for Auggie's next adventure! In Maths, we have been learning about different units of measure. We have concentrated on our understanding of capacity, length and mass as well as converting the different units. In History, we have researched and learned about Oliver Cromwell and his part in the English Civil War. The children had a good discussion in class about whether he should be remembered as a hero or a villain! In Science, we learned about how we see different objects. The children explained this in their own (written) words and drew scientific diagrams showing how we are able to do this. We have also enjoyed experimenting with collage in Art. We used the technique of Henri Matisse known as "painting with scissors"; this involves drawing and cutting different shapes using coloured paper and then arranging them into a collage (sometimes based around a "figure").
