We have had a lovely week in reception, making the most of our outdoor learning in the beautiful weather! We have enjoyed building obstacle courses, water play, parachute games and picnic snacks in the sun!

In Maths we have been exploring mass by using spring and balance scales to measure the Weight of objects around our classroom. We have compared different items using key vocabulary such as lighter, heavier, lightest and heaviest.

In English We have started our new instruction Writing unit. We have explored ideas of how to catch a Wolf, linked to our class story 'Little Red.' The children came up With some Wonderful ideas of What equipment We Would need and the order of the instructions.



This Week in Year 1...

In English, the children have started to Write their portal narratives, The Land of the Wild Things. We are very impressed so far!

In Maths, the children have moved their learning on. They have continued to explore addition Within 10 but are now focusing on adding by counting on. This Week, they have used number tracks and number lines to add.

In RE, the children explored Why Christians pray to God. They came up with some great ideas around this!

Year 2



This Week in English, the children have begun researching and gathering information about the Wonderful rainforest animals for our information text. Be prepared to hear some fascinating facts about sloths, crocodiles and tigers!

In Science this Week, We Were very excited to explore the forest area searching for microhabitats and minibeasts. As you can see, the children really enjoyed this and it was a great reason to take our learning outdoors.

In Design Technology, the children have started to evaluate existing products. We researched soup packaging and sampled some cooked vegetables to decide which we enjoyed the most. We were very impressed with how much the children enjoyed the vegetables with lots asking for seconds!

Year 3

Maths - We have been really trying hard with our multiplication and division topic this week. Looking at our 4s and 8 times tables. Please keep logging into TT Rockstars, as we are trying to get our heatmaps green!

English - We have been planning, editing and publishing our information leaflet this week, all about rivers! We are very excited to start our new unit next Week...| Wonder What it is!

Science - We have been looking at sound this half term in Science. And my goodness, I am so impressed with the prior knowledge that Year 3 has. Keep up the good work.

History - We have also been learning about the Romans and Ancient Rome this Week in History. Maybe ask your child Why Romulus and Remus Were important to Rome.

Year 4

What a busy week we have had!

In Maths, the children have been learning how to reorder a set of numbers so that we can find the total in a quick way! We have now moved on to 'compensating' and this will continue next week. Please keep logging in to TT rockstars to practise your times tables.

In English, we have been planning for writing. We have been describing our own mythical creatures and we are planning on writing some guidance next week for how to defeat them! We are having a push on presentation, so please practise those letter joins a little over the weekend.

In History, we have enjoyed learning about how the Ancient Maya farmed and in Science, we have been learning about states of matter: Solids, Liquids and Gases.



Year 5

Another productive week in Year 5. We have written our narrative about our homeless child living on the streets of a desolate city. The children have worked hard to include examples of the Writer's Knowledge in their stories. In maths, we have been looking at decimals (tenths and hundredths). We used bead strings to develop our understanding and then looked at how to place a range of decimals on partially numbered number lines. In science we have continued our work on Space looking at the orbit times of the planets in our Solar System. We enjoyed playing the guitars in music and have researched Ancient Greek gods and goddesses in History. We were visited by the Fun Food Chef on Friday as part of our DT unit. We made pizzas- they tasted great! We have uploaded some pictures on
